Wednesday 30th – You & Your Health Series: Pneumonia in Older Adults with Hailey Bae, MD
This lecture focuses on pneumonia, an important health concern. Learn the importance of recognizing symptoms early, understanding risk factors and seeking timely medical care. Older adults may have fewer typical pneumonia symptoms, so changes in behavior, weakness, confusion or fatigue can be important warning signs. Risk increases with age, chronic health conditions, weakened immunity and difficulty swallowing. Early recognition, diagnosis and treatment can help prevent complications.
