Thursday 2nd - The Road to Health: The Story of the Eureka Springs Railroads (1882-Present)

Beginning with stagecoach transportation and later served by a railroad in 1882, the Eureka Springs Railroad was a branch line connecting the Arkansas resort town of Eureka Springs with the St. Louis and San Francisco Railway in Seligman, Missouri. By 1883, six trains a day brought passengers from all over the nation to "The Road to Health." Discover the rich history of the railroads that once served Eureka Springs and helped develop and grow the "little Switzerland of the Ozarks." Local railroad historian Mike Sypult serves as President of the Arkansas Boston Mountains Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society. 2:30pm PH (W)
