#### Thursday 18th – Resident Lecture Series: *Christian Tombs and Churches East of the Jordan River* with Dr. Jerry Rose

Dr. Rose, emeritus and former chair of the University of Arkansas Department of Anthropology, researched as a biological anthropologist in the Middle East for over three decades. He will discuss the region east of the Jordan River, taken from the Greeks by the Roman Empire in 63 BCE and lost to the Muslim Empire in 636 AD. Learn how these people lived – their diet, health and economic well-being – from graves, tombs and skeletons. Excavations revealed where Jesus was baptized, the earliest secret underground church, the earliest purpose-built church, and churches from villages and great cities built after 313 AD when Constantine converted to Christianity. Excavations also revealed numerous large wine presses that were the source of local wealth. After the Muslim conquest, churches were abandoned and mosques were constructed. **2:30pm**
