### Wednesday 15th – Aux Arcs to Ozarks History and Travel Series: *Karst Hunting in NWA* with Dr. John “Van” Brahana

Our Ozark series continues with a day trip to various karst rock formations, defining how the terrain was formed over billions of years. We will be joined by Dr. John “Van” Brahana, Professor Emeritus at the University of Arkansas. Brahana will share his knowledge of hydrogeology and karst during stops at Big Spring at Springtown and Crystal Lake, both in Benton County, Ark. The last stop will be at the Bluff Dwellers Cave in Noel, Mo., following lunch at a local eatery. **Depart: 9am R \$ (W)**

Rogers has several major industrial plants and retail centers and is one of the fastest-growing cities in Arkansas.
