Monday 7th and Monday 28th - NEW CLASS! Music Through the Ages with Erik Lawrence

Join pianist Erik John Lawrence for a dive into the world of Western art music from the past 1,000 years! Referencing the textbook *A History of Western Music* by Donald Jay Grout, we will explore origins and development of the modern harmonic and structural language that make up our collective sense of musical meaning. Learning instrumentation, voice leading and formal analysis, we will gain greater appreciation for the deep well of "classical" music and see how tradition informs music written and enjoyed today. Semimonthly seminar-style presentations will include recordings and scores selected from European and American music of the past millennium, along with conversational Q & A time. **10:30am PH R (W)**

Thursday 10th - Architecture Church Tour Series: Thorncrown Chapel and St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church

BTV's next architecture-focused outing to Eureka Springs will visit Thorncrown Chapel, designed by Arkansas Architect E. Fay Jones. Inspired by Sainte Chappelle, Paris' light-filled gothic chapel, Thorncrown is 48 feet tall with over 6,000 square feet of glass and 425 windows. The chapel's appearance evolves constantly as the qualities of daylight change. Then, we visit St. Elizabeth of Hungary Catholic Church, a unique hillside structure erected in 1880 that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. In the 1950s, Father Joseph Lauro began extensive interior restoration, enlisting the help of an Italian artists' society. Under the direction of sculptor Checchi Mario, marble statues were created to grace the church gardens. A side stop will include lunch and the Eureka Springs Carnegie Public Library, one of four Arkansas libraries built between 1906 and 1915, using grants from philanthropist Andrew Carnegie. **Depart 8:30am R \$ (W)**

Tuesday 15th - Thursday 17th - Aux Arcs to Ozarks: Overnight Trip to Osage Nation in the Springfield Plateau

We continue our *Aux Arcs to Ozarks* journey to the Springfield Plateau in northeast Oklahoma for an Osage experience. We will visit Pawhuska, Okla., established in 1872, known for its rich history of the Osage Nation that is woven into the city. The city was named in honor of Chief Paw-Hiu-Skah and is home to the Osage Tribal Museum - the oldest tribally owned and continuously operated museum in the U.S. as well as the Osage Nation Headquarters. We will stop at The Pioneer Woman Mercantile, tour the movie set of the film *Killers of the Flower Moon* and visit Joseph Williams' Tall Grass Prairie Preserve.
