Dr. Angela Norman, DNP, GNP, ACNP of El Dorado, Arkansas currently serves at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Donald W. Reynolds Institute on Aging as the Associate Director of the Centers on Aging. Norman also serves as a clinical Professor at UAMS College of Nursing.

Dr. Norman holds a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree from the University of Tennessee Health Science Center, a Master of Nursing Science degree and a Bachelor of Nursing degree from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. She is recognized statewide and beyond for her leadership and focus in the community-based care of older adults and families across the long-term care spectrum, focusing specifically on those affected by dementia. She is committed to caring for older adults in the State of Arkansas and regularly provides educational opportunities through the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Dr. Norman has trained over 2,000 healthcare professionals and first-responders in and out of the state of Arkansas on dementia care.

Dr. Norman is nationally certified as a Certified Dementia Practitioner and instructor by the National Council of Certified Dementia Practitioners and was named Educator of the Year by the NCCDP. Recently, she was named as faculty for the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society's Geriatric Leadership Academy.

Dr. Norman is an active part of the Arkansas Quality Partners Initiative.

Dr. Norman developed a model of care designed specifically for those living with dementia in long-term care. The model has been adopted by Arkansas Quality Partners as the state model and is being implemented into nursing homes and assisted living facilities across Arkansas.

Dr. Norman was recently appointed by Governor Hutchinson to the Palliative Care Task Force. She serves on numerous boards and committees across the state of Arkansas regarding aging, Alzheimer's and Dementia. Her mission now is to build a dementia friendly state and country by creating support and resources for those living with dementia and their families.
